Jincheng Tree Policy, 2007

Tree removal requires approval by 2 Departments 6 million trees must be planted each year For each tree cut down or dead, two must be planted.





Total Forest coverage: 39.2%

Central forest coverage: 45.8%--up 8.7% Per capita green space: 15.5 m²—up 6.2%















Comprehensive green management system









2007-2011
20 million new trees (avg. 11,000 daily) reserving land for tree-planting and involving volunteers







Taihang Mountain Ecological Restoration (2000)

9 natural reserves off limit to residential and industrial development 380 local plants reintroduced: cedar, blue orchid, hibiscus, ginkgo, etc. Nov. 2011 Survey: 86 bird species, 32 insect species






















